

Does the school billing Medicaid impact the student's ability to receive Medicaid services outside of school?

Not if both services are considered medically necessary and meet Federal Medicaid law.

Does a copy of the IEP have to be provided to NH Medicaid ?

No, however a school may be asked to provide a list of related services specified in the IEP to NH Medicaid or Managed Care Providers (MCO) that are Medicaid billable.

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NH "Medicaid To Schools"



A mechanism for local schools to receive funding for some services they provide to students with Individualized Education Plans.



What is Medicaid to Schools?

"Medicaid to Schools" is a way for schools to receive part of its costs from the federal government for some services that are Medically related services in a students Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

What are some examples of a covered service under Medicaid to schools?

- ◆ Occupational Therapy
- ◆ Physical Therapy
- ◆ Nursing Services
- ◆ Speech, Language and Hearing Services
- ◆ Psychological Services
- ◆ Psychiatric Services
- ◆ Mental Health Services
- ◆ Vision Services
- ◆ Transportation To Medical Appointments
- ◆ Medical Exams and Evaluations
- ◆ Specialized Transportation
- ◆ Pre-school Services
- ◆ Supplies and equipment related to vision, speech, language and hearing services, occupational, physical therapy services, and nursing supplies.



Who is eligible for Medicaid to schools program?

A student who meets all of the following:

- ◆ is covered by NH Medicaid
- ◆ is less than 22 years old
- ◆ has an IEP
- ◆ is in a public school that is an enrolled Medicaid provider

Does a parent have to give permission for schools to use their child's Medicaid number?

Yes, a school must ask the parent for the Medicaid number and the parent must provide "Informed Consent". This is often done during the IEP process.



Where do you get services if they are paid for by Medicaid to Schools?

This can happen in a variety of places depending on what the student's IEP says. Services can be provided at schools during the regular school or they can happen outside of the usual school day. Services can be provided by school staff or by a subcontractor.

Who owns any equipment that is bought for the student using Medicaid to schools funds?

Any purchased property belongs to the student and his/her family. This also applies to equipment that comes from a used equipment program or that is rented for the student.

Can a family take equipment home if it was purchased by Medicaid to Schools?

Yes, any equipment that is purchased by Medicaid can be taken home or taken to another district if a student moves.

How do you know if equipment was purchased with Medicaid to schools funds?

The best way to find out the answer to this question is to ask your school district. We also suggest that you consider asking your school district in writing if the purchase was made using Medicaid funds.

This is often the best way to get the answer as the school personnel sitting at your team meeting may not have direct knowledge of the funding stream used. A written request will assist them in obtaining your answer.
